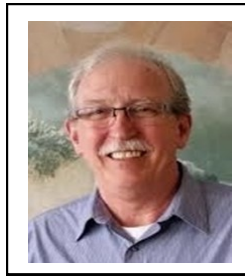

Pastor's Column



In his *Prairie Home Companion* radio program Garrison Keillor often refers to the Catholic Church in Lake Wobegon: Our Lady of Perpetual Responsibility.

"Perpetual Responsibility..." I'm afraid that's how we feel at least some of the time. I know I do. But we've had enough positive experiences to understand it really isn't that way at all, that our Christian faith is a relationship to Jesus – and that it's not a load but a lift. I've struggled to find an expression that would show the difference between the way we sometimes feel and the way we know it actually is. The best I've come up with so far is: Lovers never ask, "What's the least I can do?"

Ask any parent who gets up at 2:00 a.m. and then at 3:00 a.m. and then at 3:30 a.m. to answer the cry of a sick baby. Lovers never ask, "What's the least I can do?"

Ask any man whose income is so limited that after he pays his rent and buys his groceries he has only pennies to spare. But his sweetheart has a birthday the next month and he has his eye on something that means he'll have to go without lunch for three weeks. So he buys it.

Boys' Town near Omaha has made capital of a poster showing a little guy toting a tyke nearly as big as he is, saying, "He's not heavy; he's my brother."

Are any of these lovers looking for a medal? No. It just feels natural. For example: how does the sweetheart react to her birthday present? Unless she's cold and cruel or perhaps trying to shuck him off, when his birthday comes around, she'll also buy something way beyond her means. It's only natural.

In the same way, our Lord has been extravagant with us and the duty that this extravagance calls forth comes naturally. When we discover what Christ's atonement has done for us, then we can live without the strain of thinking of alibis. We can relax with ourselves and not be uptight about what others think of us because God has claimed us as members of his family. That's not bad. We can even feel better about our family, our in-laws, our neighbors, our coworkers,

our enemies. When we see that Christ's atonement even makes up for their faults, then we don't have to stir up our stomach juices about their defects. What a relief to live forgiven! As we grow in our appreciation of that, we grow in our love for the Lord.

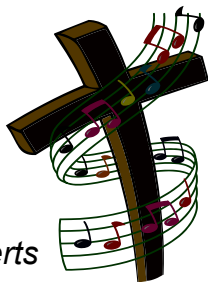

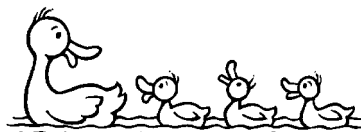

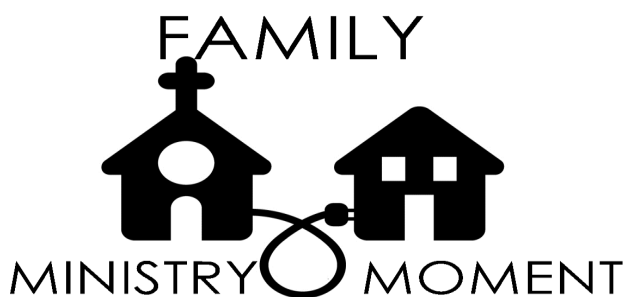

May is Christian Home month. The Bernice Nailen Memorial Library has several titles on parenting and family life. Please stop in and check out these or other titles in your library.

Have a Happy Family by Friday: how to improve communication, respect and teamwork in five days by Kevin Leman. (306.85 L54)

Dr. Kevin Leman is an internationally known psychologist and humorist. He has written several books and appeared on television shows. In this book the author's emphasis is on how to 1) communicate honestly and kindly, 2) prioritize the right things, 3) maintain great attitudes and behaviors, 4) determine the role they play in the family structure and 5) make family time count. So if "you're sick of the word *whatever*," "a good day is when you only send your kids to their room once," or "the only family member who listens to you is the dog" investigate this book.

How to Raise an Adult: break free of the overparenting trap and prepare your kid for success by Julie Lythcott-Haimes. (306.874 L99)
Julie Lythcott-Haimes served as dean of freshman and undergraduate advising at Stanford University for a decade. It was in this capacity that she noticed the rise in parental involvement in students' lives along with the lack of a strong sense of self and being poorly equipped to handle the demands of adult life in students. Using research, conversations and insights Lythcott-Haimes highlights the ways in which overparenting harms children, their stressed-out parents and our society. She offers strategies to allow children to make their own mistakes in the development of resilience, resourcefulness and inner determination.

Now That They are Grown: successfully parenting your adult children by Ronald J. Greer. (549.1 G85)

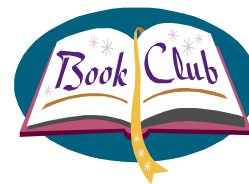
Ronald J. Greer is the Director of the Pastoral Counseling Service at Peachtree Road United Methodist Church in Atlanta, Georgia, having been with this ministry for thirty years. He is an ordained United Methodist minister. "We don't stop being parents when our kids are grown...but some things

do change." Greer assists parents in making the transition from parenting children to being parents of young adults. He encourages a new relationship with grown children that is based on mutual respect, support without intrusion, caring without enabling dependency and appropriate boundaries.

The Opposite of Spoiled: raising kids who are grounded, generous, and smart about money by Ron Lieber. (649.1 L62)

Ron Lieber, the personal finance columnist for *The New York Times* encourages parents to talk with their children about money. He covers the best way to handle the tooth fairy, allowance, chores, charity, savings, birthdays, holidays, cell phones, splurging, clothing, cars, part-time jobs, and college tuition. He also identifies modesty, patience, generosity and perspective as traits that parents hope to instill in their young adults. Lieber encourages parents to embrace the connection between money and values.

FALL BIBLE STUDY

Pastor Gary is considering a 30-week long Bible study in the fall, possibly led after the 11:00 service. The study, *Jesus in the Gospels*, is very similar to one of the Disciple Bible Studies and both were created by the same people. The format is similar. Each session is 60 to 90 minutes. This is the publisher's description of the study:

JESUS IN THE GOSPELS is a 30-week study that invites believers to look at Jesus in each of the four Gospels and ask the question, "Who is the Jesus that you see?" Study the names, the places, and the people—and encounter the Jesus who is both hard to ignore and hard to control, as portrayed in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

One of the principal approaches used in the study is the reading and comparing of the differences and similarities in the Gospel accounts of the same events.
